Conservation Case study - Coleridge Cottage

We were part of the major re-development project that took place at Coleridge Cottage in 2011. Parts of the cottage, never previously open to the public were sympathetically restored to incorporate the true history of the property.

Works involved opening up two fire places within the cottage one being in the second parlour which required structural support and sympathetic repairs so as not to loose any of the original features and the other was in the kitchen where upon removal an old tiled floor was found. This involved careful work to make sure that the original features were kept in tact and in keeping with that of the cottage. Other areas included strengthening floors and carrying out a complete re-decoration throughout the cottage, using Casien Bound Distemper paints.

The courtyard area of the property required a large amount of work as it was to be used as a tearoom's. This involved taking up and re-laying the cobbled/tiled floor, pointing works to the walls, the installation of a kitchen and decorating/lime-washing walls.

To the outside of the property, major landscaping was carried out to form a new entrance and driveway with double gates.
